Term

Those elected will take office on July 1, 2010 and will serve a three-year term of office. The National President, National Treasurer and Regional Vice Presidents serve year one as “elect,” year two as “current” and year three as “immediate past.”

In accordance with AGA’s Travel Policy, AGA pays for the costs associated with performing your duties as an AGA leader.



Qualifications and Eligibility National President-Elect

To serve as the National President-Elect, a nominee should:

- be an AGA member in good standing;
- have a professional background commensurate with the position;
- have held elective office as an Regional Vice President or chapter officer or director for at least one complete year as of the date of nomination; and
- have served as a voting member on the National Board of Directors for one complete year as of the date of nomination.
- Individuals serving in this position may not serve concurrently in any other elective office of the Association.

National Treasurer-Elect

To serve as the National Treasurer-Elect, a nominee should:

- be an AGA member in good standing;
- have a professional background commensurate with the position; and
- have served as any of the following for at least one complete year as of the date of nomination: (a) a member of the Finance and Budget Committee, (b) a member of the National Executive Committee, (c) a Regional Vice President or (d) an officer or director in an AGA chapter.
- Individuals serving in this position may not serve concurrently in any other elective office of the Association.



Senior Vice President for Regional Services —Section II

To serve as a Senior Vice President for Regional Services, a nominee should:

- be an AGA member in good standing;
- have a professional background commensurate with the position; and
- have held elective office as Regional Vice President in Section II.
- Individuals serving in this position may not serve concurrently in any other elective office of the Association.

Senior Vice President At Large

To serve as a Senior Vice President At Large, a nominee should:

- be an AGA member in good standing;
- have a professional background commensurate with the position.
- Individuals serving in this position may not serve concurrently in any other elective office of the Association.

Regional Vice Presidents-Elect

To serve as a Regional Vice President-Elect, a nominee should:

- be an AGA member in good standing;
- have a professional background commensurate with the position; and
- have held elective office as an officer or director in a chapter for at least one complete year as of the date of nomination.



Sections/Regions/Chapters

AGA's Current Sections, Regions and Chapters are:

Section I

New England: (includes Boston, Hartford, Aroostook County and Maine Chapters)

North Central: (includes Central Indiana, Chicago, Circle City, Indianapolis, Minneapolis/St. Paul, Quad Cities, Southern Wisconsin and Springfield Chapters)

Northeastern: (includes New York, New York Capital, Northern New Jersey, Puerto Rico and Trenton Chapters)

Ohio-Michigan: (includes Central Ohio, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Dayton, Detroit, Greater Columbus and West Michigan Chapters)

Section II

Mid-Western: (includes Des Moines, Kansas City, Lincoln, Mid-Missouri, Omaha Metro Area, St. Louis, The Ozarks and Topeka Chapters)

South Central: (includes Baton Rouge, Central Arkansas, Jackson, Montgomery, New Orleans and West Central Mississippi Chapters)

Southwestern: (includes Albuquerque, Denver, New Mexico and Southern Arizona Chapters)

Texas-Oklahoma: (includes Austin, Dallas, El Paso, Ft. Worth, Houston, Oklahoma City and San Antonio Chapters)



Section III

California: (includes Central Coast – CA, Inland Empire of California, Los Angeles, Los Angeles Civic Center, Orange County, Sacramento, San Diego, San Francisco and Silicon Valley Chapters)

Northwestern: (includes Alaska Capital, Central Washington, Mid-Columbia Basin, Mid-Willamette Valley, Northwest Inland Empire, Olympia, Portland and Seattle Chapters)

Pacific Rim: (includes Guam, Hawaii, Japan and Northern Mariana Islands Chapters)

Rocky Mountain: (includes Idaho Centennial, Lake Missoula, Northern Nevada, Northern Utah and South Dakota Chapters)

Section IV

Capital: (includes Beckley, Montgomery/Prince Georges County, Northern Virginia, Charleston, WV, Mid-Ohio Valley, WV and Washington, D.C. Chapters)

Mid-Atlantic: (includes Baltimore, Central Pennsylvania, Dover Capital, N.C. Triangle, Old Dominion University, Philadelphia, Richmond, Roanoke, Virginia Peninsula and Norfolk State University Chapters)

Southeastern: (includes Atlanta, Central Kentucky, Charleston, SC, Chattanooga, Columbia, SC, East Tennessee, Nashville and Tallahassee Chapters)



Nominations Process

If you are interested in serving, please submit a completed nominations package by the deadline noted below. Only one nomination per candidate is necessary. Additional nominations for a candidate should not be solicited. Candidates for elective office are reminded that the national bylaws do not permit campaigning for any elective offices. “Endorsements” for national officers are unnecessary and the nominating process will not recognize endorsements of candidates. All submissions will be forwarded to the National Nominating Committee who will fill the National Officer slate by choosing one candidate per position. (Therefore, since the committee often receives more than one nomination per position, not every nominee will be selected.) Nominees will be notified of the National Nominating Committee’s slate of candidates approximately six weeks after the deadline. AGA bylaws stipulate that members may submit petition nominations until February 1, 2010. However, if no petition nominations are received, the Nominating Committee’s slate of candidates takes office on July 1, 2010.

Submissions and Deadline

All packages must be received by close of business Friday, **October 30, 2009.**

E-submission is required. In an effort to reduce paper flow, AGA will only be accepting nomination materials in an electronic format.
