CGFM Scholarship Program

Idaho Centennial Chapter offers this scholarship program to help our members achieve the Certified Government Financial Manager designation.

To receive the scholarship, the member must:

- Pass all 3 exams
- Have not received a voucher for any of the exams
- Follow the AGA code of Ethics

Once you have submitted all the required documentation (Please see website for specific details), the chapter will reimburse one test fee. If all three test are passed within a year, AGA will reimburse the CGFM application fee.

Maximum amount reimbursed is \$195.

Certification choose the best

CGFM or Certified Government Financial Manager is a professional certification awarded by AGA.

It shows competency in : Governmental Accounting, Auditing, Financial Reporting, Internal Controls and Budgeting at the federal, state, and local levels.

How do you become a CGFM?

Submit an online application and meet the following requirements:

Ethics - Agree to abide by AGA's code of ethics


Education - Have a bachelor's degree in any subject area from an accredited U.S. college or university

Examinations - Pass three comprehensive CGFM examinations

Exprience - Have at least two years of professional level experience in government financial managment
