
Bond Disclosure - What is it and why is it necessary? February, 4, 2025



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### RECAP OF 2024 PDT

### October 21st and 22nd, 2024

Our AGA Central Ohio Chapter 40<sup>th</sup> annual professional development training (PDT) conference was held on October 21st and 22nd, 2024 at the Quest Conference Center. We had 195 registered for the conference, almost 30 more than last year. We provided a wide variety of topics for the conference, featuring 25 different presenters and 25 general and break-out sessions. Highlights included sessions on emerging issues in government accounting, cybersecurity, and the impact of AI, among others. We had a Happy Hour after the first day at Liberty Tavern, sponsored by Cognificent Learning, for an opportunity to network with your peers in addition to the time at the conference.

Many thanks to our Education Committee members and Cognificent Learning who assisted with planning the conference throughout the year and all who volunteered as monitors for sessions and provided other assistance during the conference. Congratulations to Dr. Carri L. Brown, Fairfield County Auditor, who received our Excellence in Government Leadership Award.

- 98% felt the PDT met or exceeded their expectations
- 93% definitely would recommend the PDT to others
