December 2016 Luncheon Topic Dean Ritz of Workiva discussed Digital Accountability and Transparency Act of 2014 (DATA Act)

Mr. Ritz's presentation consisted of describing the DATA Act, how well implementation is going, technical issues being sorted out, and the impact of the Act on government agencies, Congress, and the general public. The Data Act will have a long-ranging and significant impact on how data is collected and used. Several of our members joined into the conversation, discussing how the Act will impact current reporting requirements required by grantor agencies.

In a nutshell, Mr. Ritz explained the Act as requiring all Federal agencies to provide reliable financial and operating information in a standard electronic format for display at the web site **USASpending.gov**. Once the information is on the site, the general public as well as Congress and the agencies themselves can extract data for analysis of an agency's efficiency and effectiveness both individually and as part of the government as a whole.

The Act calls for full implementation by May 2017. Most cabinet-level agencies are on track to meet this May 2017 deadline. While Mr. Ritz is cautiously optimistic, he did indicate that some, most notably the

Department of Defense, may require extensions of the deadline.

The Office of Management and Budget and the US Treasury are the lead agencies in assuring accurate information is received in a standard format. The Government Accountability Office is also providing significant input.

Receiving timely information, along with assuring the data is accurate and presented in a standardized format, are the challenges. Mr. Ritz's firm, **Workiva**, is chiefly involved in the standardization issue. This is accomplished by developing a data dictionary that provides mandatory account categories while allowing agencies the flexibility to open subcategories. In this way, agency-specific information is not lost, but at the same time, the data remains comparable between the agencies.

Recognition Levels:

The **Platinum Chapter Designation** will be presented to any chapter that attains between 19,501 and 22,000 credits for the year. The chapter president's plaque will include recognition that the chapter has achieved Platinum status.
