

David Mader is the OMB Controller. He was confirmed on July 17, 2014. He previously served as Senior Vice President for Strategy and Organization at Booz Allen Hamilton, a position held since 2007. From 2004 and 2007, he was a Principal at Booz Allen Hamilton focusing on strategy and organization. From 2003 to 2004, Mr. Mader was the Managing Director of the Public Sector practice of Sirota Survey Intelligence. Before joining Sirota Survey Intelligence, Mr. Mader held various positions at the Internal Revenue Service from 1971 to 2003, including Acting Deputy Commissioner, Acting Deputy Commissioner for Modernization and CIO, Assistant Deputy Commissioner, and Chief for Management and Finance. Mr. Mader received a B.S. from Mount St. Mary's University.

Christina Ho Executive Director for Data Transparency Bureau of the Fiscal Service

Christina Ho is the Executive Director for Data Transparency at Bureau of the Fiscal Service. In support of the President's Open Government initiative and Fiscal Service's strategic goal to promote data transparency and usefulness as a public good, Christina was recently appointed to this position. Christina's efforts will be focused on advancing government-wide efforts to improve open, accountable, and participatory government through reliable, timely, secure, and consumable financial management data. In this new role, she will lead a cross-government data initiative designed to promote transparency, facilitate better decision making, and improve operational efficiency across the federal government. In 2014, she was named as one of the "Fierce 15" winners by FierceGovernment and received the Big Data Innovation Award by Federal Big Data Summit for her innovative work in data transparency at Treasury.

Prior to this appointment, Christina was the Assistant Commissioner, Government Wide Accounting responsible for the centralized financial accounting and reporting services and policy relating to the federal government's financial and operational performance to the Congress, customer agencies, American citizens, and other stakeholders. From September 2009 to September 2011, Christina served as the Deputy Assistant Commissioner responsible for the auction operations of Treasury marketable securities used to finance the US Government.

Prior to joining the Federal Government in September 2009, Christina was a senior manager at Deloitte & Touche, LLP (Deloitte) serving many high-profile publically traded companies in the financial services industry. Christina is a certified public accountant (CPA) and a certified information system auditor (CISA).







Updates to the FY2014 SF-133

Background

Last August, Treasury updated the crosswalk for the SF-133 Report on Budget Execution and Budgetary Resources. While a number of attribute values changed on the crosswalk, I am going to look specifically at the new lines that were added to report on balances from expired funds.

Section I – Schedule of Budgetary Resources

The first section starts out with a listing of beginning balances, adjustments, and authority transfers (including recoveries) ending with an Unobligated balance total on line 1050. In FY2013, the next line after 1050 was appropriations on line 1100, but for FY2014, a new subsection has been added for expired funds on lines 1060 through 1099. These closely parallel the values in the preceding subsection as shown in the chart below. When producing the report for a specific Treasury Symbol (TAS), the values in 1060 through 1099 should either be the same as 1000 through 1050 or all zeros. Because subsection 2 duplicates the amounts in subsection 1, the total from subsection 2 (line 1099) is not included when calculating the section total on line 1910.

The names of the respective lines are mostly the same except the second subsection's lines include the word "Expired". Line 1060 specifies that unobligated balances in an expired fund are "available for adjustment only". The first subsection includes seven lines (1013, 1024, 1025, 1031, 1040, 1041, and 1042) not included in the second because all the activity on those lines pertain only to unexpired funds. The Standard General Ledger (SGL) Accounts assigned to each line are the same except any account balance that is only for unexpired funds has been excluded from the second subsection, and in the first subsection, account 4199 Transfer of Expired Expenditure Transfers – Receivable was moved from line 1010 to 1012 while in the second subsection, account 4199 remained on line 1070 (which might be an oversight).

Section II – Status of Budgetary Resources

The second section breaks out obligation activity by apportionment category then lists the unobligated amounts by a number of different attributes. Only line 2403 includes expired authority, though this is lumped together with negative anticipations and unapportioned authority. So the FY2014 version adds line 2413 that only shows the amount for expired funds. Because line 2413 duplicates the amounts online 2403, line 2413 is not included when calculating the subsection total on line 2490 or the section total on line 2500.

Conclusion

Since these new lines mostly duplicate existing lines, it should be fairly straightforward to add them. The main difference is that only expired symbols should be reported on them.
