## AGA is Community Minded

In December, our chapter donated **\$400** to the **Children's Miracle Network** through Carilion hospital as our annual chapter donation for the holidays. Below is a summary of how those funds are used by the CMN locally:

"In our region, funds raised by Children's Miracle Network Hospitals provide lifesaving medical equipment and services for the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) and pediatric units at Carilion Children's Hospital. Each year, over 5,500 hospitalized children and 29,000 children visiting Carilion Children's 17 specialty outpatient clinics benefit from the money raised by Children's Miracle Network Hospitals. The hallmark of Children's Miracle Network Hospitals is that 100 percent of funds raised remain local to enable our local hospitals to provide miracles of health and healing for local babies and children."

During the Commonwealth PDT, we helped raise \$3,003 for **St. Mary's Children's Home** in Norfolk, VA! \$2,023 came in through the GoFundMe platform, \$500 from AGA National matching 50% of anything up to \$500, and \$480 donated by the chapters in honor of the PDT speakers.
