Seattle Chapter CGFM Plan 2014 - 2015

Certification is a critical part of the AGA Mission and a major focus of the organization. Chapter involvement and support of the Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) program is essential and necessary for the continued success of the program. In addition to conducting a brief but meaningful internal assessment of lessons learned and enhancements needed from the prior operating year, the Seattle Chapter shall support CGFMs in the following manner.

I. Support current CGFMs

- A. Assist CGFMs to meet 80 hours of Continuing Professional Education (CPE) credits biannually. When possible the Chapter shall:
 - 1. Provide courses and other trainings that meet CGFM CPE requirements.
- 2. Identify CPE opportunities from sources outside the chapter including local seminars, Internet courses, and self-study and promote either on Chapter website or in newsletter.
 - 3. Promote awareness of CPE requirements.
- B. Publish CGFM members' achievements in Chapter newsletter and on the Chapter website.
- C. Market educational events to the government accountability community, members, and nonmembers.
- D. When possible, partner with other Professional Organizations or Governmental Entities to promote the CGFM designation.
- E. Encourage CGFM renewals through personal contact, letters, newsletters, or websites.
- F. Recognize local CGFMs by:
 - 1. Using the CGFM designation in chapter publications, name tags, etc.
 - 2. Publicizing new CGFMs in chapter and local publications.

II. Market CGFM service mark locally

When possible, the Chapter will Contact area government accountability leaders to promote the CGFM.

Create awareness of the value of the CGFM service mark in the general public.

Encourage area employers to change policies to recognize the CGFM.

Encourage the endorsement of the CGFM from area employers, elected officials, or principals.

Encourage the setting of specific Chapter goals to promote the CGFM in its area.

III. Assist potential new CGFMs in attaining certification

When possible or desired, the Chapter will: Offer CGFM courses Sponsor Study

IV. Using chapter resources to work with CGFM certification

The CGFM coordinator will:

Communicate with the Chapter and the Governmental Community promoting the CGFM.

Arrange for the contribution of items to the Chapter Newsletter and the Chapter website such as the CGFM recognition, Study Suggestions, Encouragement, Technical Requirements, tip of the month, etc. Attempt to retain CGFMs as Chapter members.
