

Inside the Black Box

Integrating the General Ledger

Background

The U.S. Standard General Ledger (USSGL) has always had a split personality, or perhaps it might be better to say that the budgetary and proprietary accounts are twins that sometimes act closely in concert and other times act with total independence. I have described, in a number of articles, the relationships between proprietary and budgetary balances, and even assisted Treasury with developing elimination groups. In 2007, Treasury's Financial Management Service (FMS) initiated tie points to better integrate these two parts of the SGL.

Tying It All Together

The aforementioned elimination groups were designed specifically to help with intragovern-mental eliminations. However, even transactions with the public need to be shown consistently in both the budgetary and proprietary accounts. So FMS introduced tie-points in 2007. There are twenty tie-points, and over half of them relate budgetary accounts to proprietary accounts. They tie together budgetary and proprietary cash, accounts payable, expenditures (to expenses/purchases and to appropriations used), advances (in and out), receivables, exchange collections, appropriations received, and net position. The other tie-points ensure that proprietary accounts balance, beginning balances equal last year's post-close balances, anticipated resources equal statuses in the budgetary accounts, and there is no activity in USSGL 310000, 331000 or 420100. Some of the latter type of tie-points were incorporated as edits in the Governmentwide Treasury Account Symbol Adjusted Trial Balance System (GTAS). However, the tie-points not included in GTAS are still very useful for preparing financial statements. Agencies that haven't already looked at the tie-points should download the spreadsheet workbooks from the Treasury website www.fiscal.treasury.gov/fsreports/ref/ussgl/tie-point_project/archives_tiepoints.htm.

Unfortunately, the tie-points workbooks haven't been updated in a decade. For example, they include only 370 of the 550 FY2017 USSGL accounts, but they include 27 accounts that are no longer USSGL. Many of the new accounts are specialized, so most agencies won't use them. In cases where an old USSGL account was split up into several, more specialized, accounts, it is easy to map the new accounts to where the old one is in the tie-points.

For the other new accounts, it should be possible to determine which new accounts need to be included in which tie-points by reviewing the associated posting models.

Conclusion

Last year, the USSGL turned thirty. While it has enabled many agencies to improve accounting practices and financial management, it still has room for improvement. Better integration of existing budgetary and proprietary USSGL accounts will help move agencies forward.
