
#### Enjoy podcasts? Check out AGA's Accountability Talks!


### NATIONAL PDT 2019

The 2019 AGA National Professional Development Training (PDT) was a held in the Creole culture of New Orleans, LA. The city of festivals provided a vibrant backdrop for engaging training in emerging hot topics for government finance professionals. A Creole cooking demonstration kicked off a great few days, where attendees learned about a range of topics from Artificial Intelligence in financial fields to Human Resources issues facing the workforce we are part of. Albuquerque Chapter Accountability Chair Donna Sandoval participated in the compelling speaking session *Ignite!* And participated on the panel for *Data Driven Organizations*. For *Ignite!* she described her journey in accounting during a series of 20 slides in 5 minutes to a packed room.

Donna joined Albuquerque Chapter members Jennifer Baca, Heather Prudhomme, and Misty Schuck at the training event. Plenary sessions showcased the ongoing strategies of the GAO's financial position though a great question and answer format between Comptroller Gene Dodaro and AGA CEO Ann Ebberts, and other motivators discussed working with those who are not like us and living to achieve our highest dreams. The 2019 PDT was the highest attended PDT ever with approximately 2,500 government finance professionals in attendance and service.

In the service realm, the PDT charity drive raised \$30,000! All proceeds from raffles, silent auction items, and donations were given to Wounded Warrior Project, Habitat for Humanity, and St. Jude Children's Research Hospital. The Albuquerque Chapter donated \$100 to the chapter challenge and a set of Nambe utensils that were hotly contested in the silent auction. We are proud to support the great initiatives of our National organization and support the ongoing education of our members!

During the awards luncheon, the Albuquerque Chapter collected three awards for the 2018-2019 program year: Platinum Chapter, CGFM and Community Service. Congrats Albuquerque AGA!

The CCR is a simple and understandable format that provides information on your mission, spending, performance and outlook. The CCR is a visually appealing fourpage document that includes community information such as population figures, regional characteristics and government goals for the community; detailed cost and revenue information; performance information for key service areas; and a look at "what's next" in the year ahead.

One of the many benefits of being a member of the Albuquerque Chapter is that Donna Sandoval is now leading a national Accountability & Transparency Committee.
