### Eileen W. Parlow

Ms. Parlow is an Assistant Director with the FASAB. She came to FASAB in February 2004 from the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense (Comptroller), where she had the lead responsibility for implementing the U.S. Government Standard General Ledger, credit reform accounting, and the OMB's Business Rules for Intragovernmental Transactions. She has worked for over fifteen years resolving Federal government-wide accounting and reporting policy issues at the Department of Defense, the U.S. Department of Education, and the FASAB, often serving on the U.S. Standard General Ledger Board and numerous other government-wide working groups. At the U.S. Department of Education, she was responsible for budgetary reporting and audited financial statements for the Direct Student Loan Program. Prior to her Federal career, Ms. Parlow's experience included non-profit accounting, private sector financial statements, and four years as the Comptroller for the U.S. operations of the London Times.

In addition to a Summa Cum Laude Bachelor of Science degree in Accounting from Southeastern University, Ms. Parlow holds a Bachelor of Arts degree with departmental honors in Psychology from St. Joseph's College in Brooklyn, NY, and a Master's degree in Theological Studies from Harvard University. Ms. Parlow received an Elijah Watt Sells Certificate With High Distinction from the AICPA for her performance on the November 1993 Unified Certified Public Accountant Examination, and she was recognized by the Virginia Society of Certified Public Accountants for achieving the highest score in Virginia. She is a Certified Public Accountant licensed in the Commonwealth of Virginia and a Certified Government Financial Manager.

## James R. Dalkin

Mr. Dalkin is a Director in the Financial Management and Assurance Team with the U.S. Government Accountability Office (GAO). He also serves as a member of the AICPA’s Auditing Standards Board and as an observer on the COSO Advisory Board.

Mr. Dalkin has responsibility for directing GAO’s work to develop and maintain government auditing standards (the Yellow Book); internal control standards for the federal government (the Green Book); and GAO’s work with the accounting and auditing profession. He is also responsible for the audits of the Securities Exchange Commission and the Statements of Social Insurance included in the consolidated financial report of the United States. Prior to joining the GAO, Mr. Dalkin served at a global firm and audited a wide range of organizations ranging from commercial health care entities to governmental agencies.

Mr. Dalkin is a frequent speaker at national auditing conferences for AICPA and other professional organizations. He has also authored articles for publications including the Journal of Accountancy. He has contributed to the profession through his involvement with the AICPA Task Force on Restricted Use Reports and chairs the International Disclosures Task Force. Mr. Dalkin serves as an adjunct accounting faculty at Georgetown University. Mr. Dalkin has a Master’s Degree in Business Administration from the George Washington University and a Bachelor of Science in Accounting from the University of Virginia.

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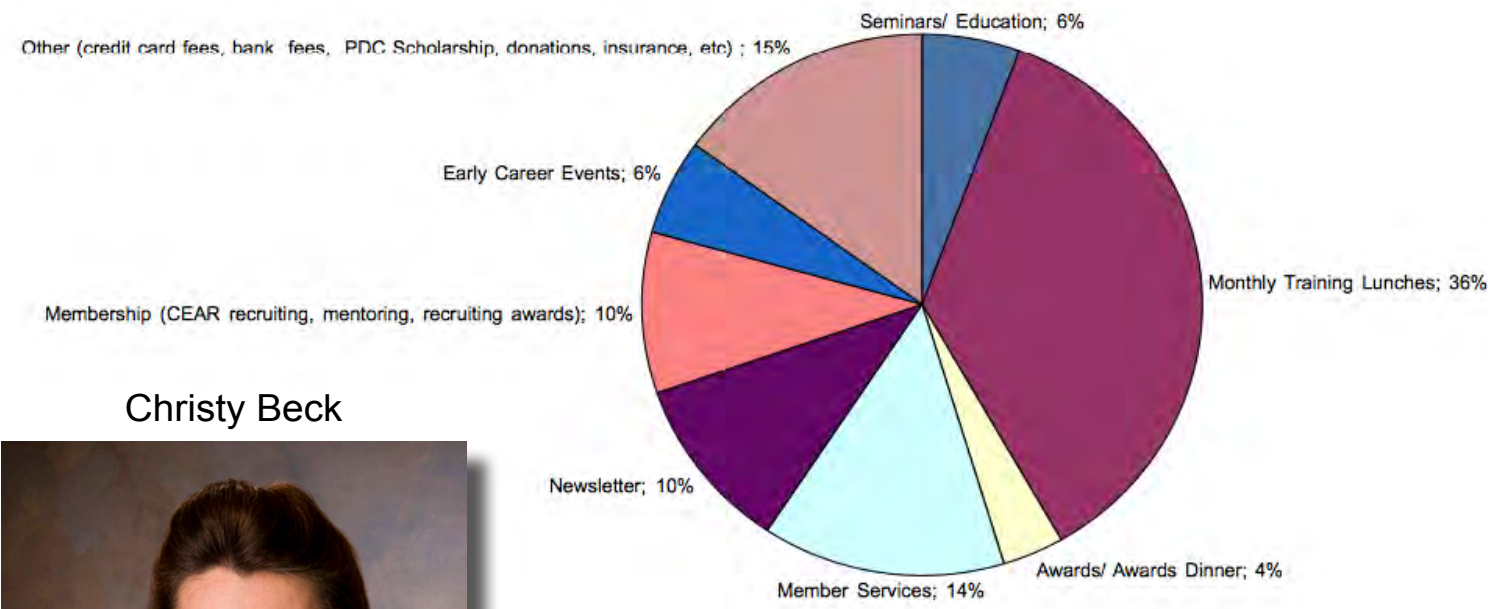

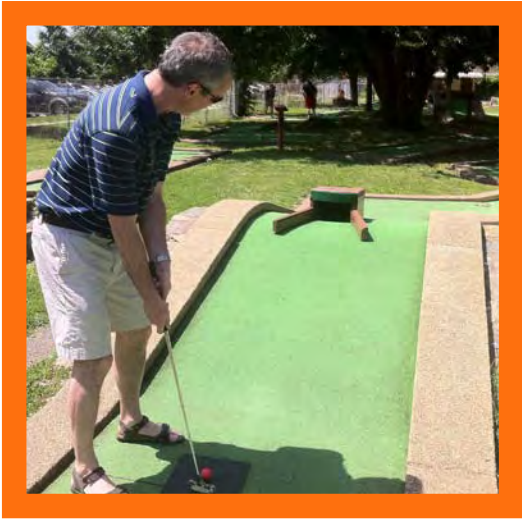

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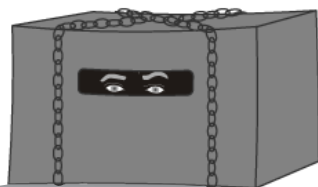

# Inside the Black Box

## Automating Allowance for Doubtful Accounts

### Introduction

In an attempt to reduce the need for customization, the Financial Systems Integration Office of the Office of Management and Budget (FSIO of OMB) released five years ago an exposure draft on a Common Governmentwide Accounting Classification (CGAC) system. The GCAC proposal will be implemented as part of GTAS (Governmentwide Treasury Account Symbol Adjusted Trial Balance System) in FY2013. If we are really serious about meaningful standardization, we need to take a hard look at what codes we have and if they really are needed.

### Code Evolution

On the first day, Treasury made SGL Accounts, and they were good. On the second day, Treasury made the Federal/Nonfederal attribute, and thought it was good until they tried to eliminate interagency transactions in FACTS I. So on the third day, Treasury made a two-digit Trading Partner, but that helped only a little. On the fourth day, Treasury made a four-digit Trading Partner. On the fifth day, Treasury placed in GTAS Trading Partner Agency Identifier Attribute (what was two-digit but is now three) and Trading Partner Main Account Identifier Attribute (a four-digit fund group), effectively creating a seven-digit Trading Partner, and we haven't gotten to day six yet. However, Trading Partner fields are only required for proprietary accounts; GTAS has eliminated the Transaction Partner, Direct Transfer Agency, and Direct Transfer Account fields that were used for budgetary accounts in FACTS II. So while the Federal/Nonfederal Code is superfluous for most proprietary accounts, it is the only such field used on budgetary accounts, plus Treasury has added a value of G for accounts (or balances) associated with the General Fund, and certain Treasury Account Symbols (TAS) can use a value of E for non-federal exceptions in certain budgetary accounts. So it looks like Federal/Nonfederal Code is here to stay.

### Conflating Fields

Some fields are interrelated and could be combined with little difficulty. One example concerns the Authority Type and Advance Flag attributes in FACTS II. One of the Authority Types is D for Advance Appropriation, while Advance Flag can be P for Prior Year, F for Future Year or X for inapplicable. GTAS eliminates the Advance Flag and added Authority Type values of E for Advance in Prior Year and F for Advance from Future Year. However, the same thing could be done for Borrowing Source as well (which only has 3 possible values: F for Federal Financing Bank, P for Public and T for Treasury), since B for Borrowing Authority is also one of the Authority Types. GTAS could use B for Federal Financing Bank, T for Treasury, and U for Public.

### Fund-Related Fields

Some of the old FACTS I and II fields are not part of the GTAS trial balance; instead they are included as part of the TAS definition on the Super Master Account File. The old FACTS I field Budget Subfunction and FACTS II field Definite/Indefinite Authority are two examples.

## Inside the Black Box (cont'd)

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### Old-Fashioned Budgeting

Budgets used to be based on cash. While agencies are now required to do accrual accounting, agency budgets are generally considered spent when the obligation (order) is incurred. However, some of the reporting requirements are still based on cash. In particular, the budgetary cash spending accounts (415300, 480200, 488200, 490200, 490800, 498200) must declare if they are disbursing old-year money or new-year money with the Year of Budget Authority (YBA) attribute. This antiquated approach is difficult for accountants to deal with, since no-year funds carry over into the new year's budget and are often apportioned, allotted, and spent as one pot of money. Perhaps OMB can eliminate the YBA attribute and the cash reporting requirement for the sake of accrual accounting.

### Using the Big Picture

An SGL trial balance assumes one is using the SGL accounting model. Since debits must equal credits, often the information required from an attribute is available from the SGL account posted on the other side of the entry. So if OMB really needs to know whether old or new funds were disbursed (using the YBA attribute), they can add carryover (account 4201) to collected recoveries (487200 and 497200) to get the maximum old-year authority, and if disbursements is more than that, then that is the old-year amount that was disbursed, and if disbursements is less than that, then all disbursements were of old-year authority.

Similarly, the amount of reimbursable expenditures incurred is equal to the change in balances for 425100 and 425200 Reimbursements and Other Income Earned – Receivable and – Collected. Many years ago, the SGL used account 4241 and 4242 for Unfilled Customer Orders Unpaid and Paid, and this account had the same balance as reimbursable undelivered orders (the 48xxxx series). It would be easier to revive the 424xxx accounts and use the balances of accounts 424100 through 425200 to determine reimbursable obligations than to split out the 48xxxx and 49xxxx series of accounts into reimbursable and direct via the Reimbursable attribute.

### Conclusion

There are many benefits to consistency and standardization that CGAC can yield. The yield will be even greater, though, if we take this opportunity to reassess the many SGL attributes and eliminate or combine those that are superfluous.
