October 15th Luncheon Speaker: Nathan Clayville, Economist from Dept. Financial Management

Nathan Clayville spoke about his job role as an economist for the Economic Analysis Bureau in the Dept. of Financial Management. Their responsibility is to assist the Governor and the State of Idaho with developing the revenue side of the Executive Budget. They also actively monitor the economic and revenue performance of the state. Nathan shared about the highly complex mathematical model used to create forecasts on a quarterly basis, which allows for different what-if scenarios. Nathan highlighted that the public has access to the generated reports on DFM's website and passed around printed examples to the audience. These reports are to assist in projecting tax and general fund revenue. Nathan went into further detail about the breakdown of the revenue, by showing that income tax is almost half of the state's revenue source. Idaho generally receives about 95-135 million per month and that it usually will increase during months the S&P 500 is doing well, due to the public increasing their withholdings. An interesting outlier that was noted, was that the lottery can skew distribution data as it is such a large amount compared to the regular numbers! While educating us on the details of the forecast model, Nathan also gave a great question and answer session in regards to economic outlook questions and how the process works when setting the budget.
