Prepare taxes free of charge become a volunteer with the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA). You will receive training to provide free basic income tax help for low-to-moderate income families who need assistance preparing their tax returns. Training is offered both online and in the classroom.

- As a Tax Volunteer, you'll be assigned to work with a sponsoring organization. First to receive training and then to begin volunteering at a location in your community.
- Tax sites are generally open nights and weekends and the hours are flexible.
