President's Message - December 2023

Happy Holidays & Season Greetings from the Des Moines Chapter CEC! As we are getting ready for the New Year I wanted to take a moment and look back at what the Des Moines Chapter of AGA has accomplished over the past year. In calendar year 2023, four (4) new members joined our chapter, we offered a total of 37 hours of CPE, saw an average of 11 attendees at the three Lunch n' Learns held during the year and an average of 18 attendees at Webinars. We offered a full 8 hours of CPE at our all-day hybrid spring seminar back in April with a total of 96 attendees.

The Des Moines Chapter of AGA has a lot to look forward to in 2024. We are starting 2024 with 67 active members and we are offering a total of 29 hours of CPE through June. June 1st was the start of the new Achievements in Chapter Excellence (ACE) Program Year. The CEC set the following goals for the upcoming year:

Membership Goals:

- Maintain current membership base of 66 members.

Education Goals:

The mission of Special Olympics Iowa is to provide year-round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for individuals with intellectual disabilities by giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy, and participate in a sharing of gifts, skills and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes, and the community.

Iowa Remembers is a 501(c)(3) non-profit charity run solely by volunteers. Founded in 2010, Iowa Remembers is located in Grimes, Iowa. The mission of Iowa Remembers is "To remember and honor the Iowa military casualties of war from Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation New Dawn. Their sacrifice, and that of all the others who have died, will never be forgotten."

The National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) is dedicated to improving the lives of millions of Americans affected by mental illness.
