Fall – turn over a new leaf – apply and earn your CGFM. Did you know there's scholarships for Des Moines Chapter AGA members?

- If you're a Chapter Member you can be reimbursed up to \$100 per exam upon successfully passing the respective exam.
- If you're a Chapter Member who applies to the CGFM program while actively serving on the Chapter Executive Committee (CEC) you will be reimbursed the CGFM application fee. Also, as a CEC member upon successfully passing a respective exam you shall be reimbursed the full cost of the exam.
- The CEC is always looking for Chapter Members to serve on the CEC and there's clearly an incentive if you're considering the CGFM.
- Study guides (CGFM) are available at the State Library for members to check out.

How do you become a CGFM?

- Submit an online application and meet the following requirements:
- Ethics Agree to abide by AGA's code of ethics
- Education Have a bachelor's degree in any subject area from an accredited U.S. College or University
- Examinations Pass three comprehensive CGFM examinations
- Experience Have at least two years of professional

Achievements in Chapter Excellence (ACE) Report, Kaylynn Short

June 1st was the start of the new Achievements in Chapter Excellence (ACE) Program Year. The CEC set the following goals for the upcoming year:

Membership Goals:

- Maintain current membership base of 66 members.
- Conduct a Member Satisfaction Survey and exceed an 80% satisfaction rate.

Education Goals:

- Include networking and/or social time in at least 50% of our CPE Opportunities Chapter will offer at least 8 Lunch 'n Learns during the program year with social time before each speaker.
- Chapter will work to exceed their meeting attendance from prior year.
- Chapter will survey members on how satisfied they are with educational meetings being offered.

CGFM Goals:

- Chapter will provide CGFM Exam preparation materials or exam reimbursement. Study guides are available for member use and exam reimbursement is offered to those on the CEC.
- Chapter will share CGFM information and articles in each Chapter Newsletter.
- · Chapter will seek proclamations naming March CGFM Month from counties and cities in Iowa.

- Chapter will keep the website up to date and will issue Newsletters every other month.
- Chapter will issue an Annual Citizen-Centric Report by October 31st.

The mission of Special Olympics Iowa is to provide year-round sports training and athletic competition in a variety of Olympic-type sports for individuals with intellectual disabilities by giving them continuing opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, experience joy, and participate in a sharing of gifts, skills and friendship with their families, other Special Olympics athletes, and the community.

Iowa Remembers is a 501(c)(3) non-profit charity run solely by volunteers. Founded in 2010, Iowa Remembers is located in Grimes, Iowa. The mission of Iowa Remembers is "To remember and honor the Iowa military casualties of war from Operation Iraqi Freedom, Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation New Dawn.
