For non-information technology personnel, cybersecurity can be a labyrinth of strange concepts, acronyms and techno-babble that is at best confusing and at worst terrifying. All of us rely on technical staff to secure our systems and data, and unless you are a trained IT professional, the details of cybersecurity will likely remain something of a mystery. However, a little familiarity with the fundamentals will go a long way. This session will provide a basic understanding of cybersecurity concepts and will empower the personnel who own the data and depend on the systems to better collaborate with their IT staff to ensure the integrity, availability and confidentially of financial data.

- The principles of the confidentiality, integrity and availability (CIA) triad
 - Will review case studies highlighting actual incidents and relate them to the CIA triad
- The principles of risk-based security assessment including the elements of criticality, threat and vulnerability
 - Will review examples in order to clarify why this is important to the lay-person and will explain your role in this process
- What data owners and system users can do to help their IT staff better secure their systems
 - Will review: 1) what questions you should be asking your IT staff, 2) what information you should be providing them and 3) how your business unit can work with the IT staff to affect a positive change in your cyber-preparedness

The Chapter's Programs and Technical Director, Darrolyn Worcester introduced the luncheon's speaker, Principal Consumer Credit Examiner, David Leach.

David's presentations are always invigorating, and once again he did not disappoint us with his delivery of information over the Equifax Data Breach. With David's tips and guidelines, we now have more tools to use to protect our credit profiles. Data breaches, identity theft, scams, and cybercrime are making the headlines daily; if we follow David's advice of freezing credit files and reviewing our credit reports on a quarterly basis, we provide ourselves with protection against potential fraud.

The Bureau of Consumer Credit Protection's Special Edition: Equifax Data Breach, the Downeaster Common Sense Guide to Credit Reports and Credit Scores includes the information necessary to follow David's advice. The guide includes numerous tips made by David during this February meeting. For instance, if you want to know in detail how to freeze your credit file with the three major credit reporting agencies, read the guide (the guide is free). Freezing your credit is also free under Maine's file freeze law!
