



Agency Information:

The DHHS Service Center is responsible for program accounting, cash management and revenue/expenditure control for the entire Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). The Service Center provides budget and fiscal analysis for many complex areas within DHHS including TANF (i.e. Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) and MaineCare (formerly Medicaid). We currently have a vacancy in our Augusta office. These limited period positions are authorized through October 2017. The department plans to submit legislation to make them permanent.

Job Duties:

The DHHS Service Center is seeking an experienced professional with accounting background and knowledge of the healthcare industry to join the Accounts Receivable and Account Management team. As a **Management Analyst I**, you will be responsible for data management ensuring that the Medicaid sub-ledger data is kept up-to-date and managed appropriately. You will assist in building and maintaining provider relationships, and will be expected to foster teamwork and support departmental culture with an emphasis on ensuring exceptional customer service. You will be responsible for reviewing, analyzing and managing all Account Management data/activity for Medicaid and Social Service Providers. You will be expected to adapt to fluctuations in daily assignments within a fast-paced environment. The successful candidate should possess excellent communication skills, extraordinary attention to detail and the ability to foster interpersonal relationships with internal and external customers.

Requirements:

In order to qualify, you must have six (6) years of education, training, and/or experience analyzing, evaluating, and/or developing improvements to organizational and/or managerial systems, programs, and practices. The background of well-qualified candidates will demonstrate the following competencies:

- 1. Experience and a strong working knowledge of the health care industry and medical service providers.
- 2. Prior experience and/or education which demonstrates a knowledge of Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) and experience performing reconciliations.
- 3. Examples demonstrating you are detail oriented, work independently and possess a high level of initiative.
- 4. Demonstrated ability to build and maintain client relationships and communicate effectively.
