Dear members,

Merriam-Webster defines empathy as, "...the action of understanding, being aware of, being sensitive to, and vicariously experiencing the feelings, thoughts, and experience of another of either the past or present without having the feelings, thoughts, and experience fully communicated in an objectively explicit manner." As angry as I was with the manner in which I was addressed, I had to take a step back to think about the sender and have compassion for this person. I do not know what the

sender's situation was at the time, but I can be empathetic and wish the best for them.

All of these subjects are prescient moving forward in an otherwise unknown future. I am thankful to have served as President of CKY AGA this past year and I look forward to another successful year under Alice's guidance.

Kentucky Public Pensions Authority, Director of Accounting

How did you choose government financial management as your career? Well truthfully, I didn't, it chose me. I applied for an internship with a government entity and was hired. A permanent position opened up in the Internal Audit department, I applied and was hired. After 21 years, I left that agency to come to KPPA as the Internal Auditor. I'm glad, government auditing and financial management have resulted in a great career for me.

What advice would you give a recent graduate joining the field? I would advise you to stay on top of new technology, embrace it and run with it. Also, be on top of the standards and regulations, and continue to increase your government knowledge. Join groups like the AGA that will help you do that. Network with peers and share ideas with each other.

What accomplishments are you most proud of in your career? I'm most proud of the Annual Comprehensive Financial Report that KPPA produces each year. It is a team effort, and it takes my team working with other teams to get it completed, and to meet the due date. It is a large endeavor, and requires a large amount of time and commitment.

Do you have a mentor and how has this person helped you? I have had several mentors through the years. My first boss in my first job, was one that always sticks out to me. He guided me and questioned me about audits, people, and included me in meetings so I could learn from what was happening, not just the audit information, but the politics, and body language of those around me. 




Joshua Konowe
