SENIOR FINANCIAL ANALYST—SECURITIES COMMISSIONER (TOPEKA)

The Office of the Kansas Securities Commissioner (KSC) is seeking candidates for a Senior Financial Analyst position in Topeka, Kansas.

This professional position is responsible for conducting advanced technical and complex examinations of securities registration and exemption filings to determine compliance with the Kansas Uniform Securities Act and other applicable laws, regulations and policies. The agency is also responsible for the administration and enforcement of the Kansas Loan Brokers Act. The work requires advanced technical knowledge of these laws and regulations as well as Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP).

The incumbent will effectively communicate deficiencies identified in securities registration or exemption filings to legal counsel or business executives representing the registrant; and negotiate resolution of those deficiencies. In addition, the Senior Financial Analyst will use their knowledge of accounting and finance to assist the Director, Finance and Administration in the management of

the agency's accounting and budgeting functions, and to assist with special projects.

Qualifications:

A Bachelor's degree in Business Administration with an emphasis in accounting and auditing or finance is required, including a minimum of 15 hours of accounting coursework. Must be proficient in the use of MS Word, Excel, Outlook and Powerpoint.

Experience with the State of Kansas SMART, SHARP, and IBARS systems is a plus.

Preference will be given to applicants with at least 5 years of experience involving the issuance and/or regulation of securities or 5 years of comparable professional experience in public accounting. Applicants with at least 8 years of similar regulatory or professional experience will be considered.

Starting Pay: \$65,000 - \$70,000 commensurate with education and experience. This is a full time unclassified position with benefits.

A Tax Clearance expires every 90 days. **All applicants, including current state employees, are responsible for submitting a valid**
