AGA Lifetime Member Mr. Leonard S. Richter, CGFM—Retired Topeka Chapter—Join Date July 1, 1978



Mr. Richter shared 3 pictures of AGA significance. The bottom one is his original certificate of AGA membership, the one above is his lifetime membership and the one on the left is his CGFM certificate number 0146. That's right, 0146. Len is proud to have been one of the first to be awarded that certification as he has been a proud member since 1978. When Len started with the federal government in 1973 straight out of college, to become a CPA he had to work for an auditing firm for 2 years, so he never pursued a certification. When the CGFM came along it provided career civil servants a recognition that heretofore was not available. Len is very proud to be an AGA member and an original holder of the CGFM certificate.

Mr. Richter's federal career spanned 31 years as an accountant and he retired with 34 years including his military time. Len worked for the US Small Business Administration from 1973-1978, the Economic Development Administration from 1978-1981 and the US Coast Guard as a systems accountant from 1981-2004.

Mr. Richter didn't plan to be an accountant, but as fate would have it, his destiny was set by a college professor. Len majored in Public Science with intentions of pursuing a Master's in International Relations with the goal of teaching at a Community College, but in the summer of 1969 he took a 13-week Accounting course crammed into 7 weeks. At the end of the course, the professor called Len into his office to announce that Len had a real knack for accounting and as they say, the rest is history. Mr. Richter worked full-time and went to school full-time, all while supporting a wife and 2 children. With a dedicated home and life work, Len completed 56 of his credit hours in evening classes at Community College of Philadelphia.

Mr. Richter is currently working 20 hours per week for the Capital Police. Len provided this insight during the 20 minute interview: "The mistakes that I have made has taught me how to be a better person, better worker and to not be afraid to depend on others for their thoughts and ideas".

What is CGFM?



Certified Government Financial Manager® (CGFM®) is a professional certification awarded by AGA, demonstrating competency in governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal

What are the initial requirements?

To earn the CGFM, individuals must apply for the CGFM program and meet the following requirements:

<u>Ethics</u> — read and agree to abide by AGA's *Code of Ethics* <u>Education</u> — have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university

Examinations — pass three comprehensive CGFM examinations

<u>Experience</u> — have at least two years of professional-level experience in government financial management

Maintaining CGFM Certification

To retain the CGFM certification, all CGFMs must adhere to the AGA's <u>Code of Ethics</u>. In addition, to continue using the CGFM designation after their name, CGFMs must be in an active status.

Active Status

To maintain the CGFM certification in an active status, CGFMs are required to:

- Pay the CGFM renewal fee by the due date every year.
- Complete at least 80 hours of Continuing Professional Education (CPE) every two years in government financial management topics or related technical subjects (within the designated two-year cycle).
- Maintain and, if requested by AGA, provide detailed information on CPE hours completed.

By submitting their annual renewal payment, CGFMs affirm that they have and will continue to abide by AGA's Code of Ethics and that they have fulfilled the minimum CPE Requirements.
