
The Aroostook Chapter holds CEC meetings are held the 2nd Thursday of each month. General meetings are held as necessary.



# Past Meeting Recap

On December 12, 2017, the Maine Chapter of the AGA met at the Senator Inn located in Augusta. Chapter President, Shirley Browne, welcomed the Chapter.

Darrolyn Worcester introduced our speaker, Alec Porteous, DAFS Commissioner.

Alec Porteous is the Commissioner of the Maine Department of Administrative and Financial Services. Porteous joins the Department from the Maine Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS), where he served as Chief Operating Officer and Chief Financial Officer. He joined the LePage Administration in May 2014 to serve as DHHS' Deputy Commissioner of Finance. Porteous previously worked as a policy advisor for Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher in Washington, D.C. He also worked as an associate in the investment banking division at Lehman Brothers. Prior to joining the LePage Administration, Porteous was a vice president at Harpswell Capital Advisors in New Gloucester. He also served from 2011 to 2013 as state office representative in Portland for U.S. Senator Susan Collins and as a member of her legislative staff in Washington, D.C. from 2002 to 2005. At the Department of Administrative and Financial Services, Porteous oversees eight bureaus and more than 1,200 employees servicing the executive, legislative and judicial branches, all state agencies and the general public. The Department's broad range of responsibilities for state government include budgeting and financial management, human resources, information technology services, and facilities and fleet management. In addition, the Department manages Maine Revenue Services, and Maine Lottery, and the wholesale liquor business in Maine. Porteous earned his BA from Colby College and his MBA from Cornell University.

Commissioner Porteous provided a presentation over A Reform Agenda: Advancing Fiscal Stability and Good Governance in Maine. We learned about Governor LePage's vision for reforming state government and how to move Maine forward. Porteous provided us with different types of data and analytics that supported different areas of state government that Governor LePage has achieved his goals of financial stability. He also shared information on the positive outlook Maine has for the future. During the presentation, it was clear that the Governor will leave the State in a better financial position for the next Governor, which will allow time and effort to be spent on necessary future reforms.

Commissioner Porteous' presentation was intriguing and thought provoking, leaving the group with a better understanding of the State of Maine's financial stability.

Mitch Boynton was our 50/50 raffle winner and donated his winnings to charity.
