GENERAL:

In accordance with the bylaws change passed the previous year, the number of Directors increased from seven to ten. The Awards and Chapter Competition functions were transferred to Directors as well as a new At Large function (which was to become the Workshops and Seminars function.) Education of the members

was stressed. Two mini-symposiums were held: Cost Accounting Standards, conducted by the professional staff of CASB, and; Cooperative Auditing, conducted by panelists representing municipal, state and Federal governments, as well as two representatives from prominent CPA firms. Our Chapter also contributed heavily to a very successful Cost Accounting Standards seminar held at the Shoreham Americana Hotel in Washington. We were able to obtain recognition for continuing education credits from the state of Maryland for all of our educational programs. The Education Committee continued to present programs on accounting and auditing to local high schools and colleges and manned a Federal Accounting Career booth at the annual Career Convocation at the University of Maryland. Art Schoenhaut was elected to serve as National President of the AGA for 1979-1980.
