GENERAL: This was a year of continued building. Before any goals could be achieved, however, a lingering question persisted.. should the Chapter change its name? Since a referendum of the membership in 1970 was inconclusive on this subject, the Chapter Executive Committee voted to change the name to "Suburban Maryland Chapter" based on votes cast during the referendum. Due to a technicality, however, the referendum was deemed void. When another vote of the members was taken, the outcome was to keep the name of "Montgomery-Prince Georges Chapter." The Research Committee, chaired by Bill Walsh and assisted by Jacob Seidenberg, Gene Kennedy, Michele Snyder and Sy Corwin, significantly contributed to the National Research Committee's project of

updating FGAA's Bibliography on Accounting and Auditing-Annotated. The Committee was honored at the National Symposium for its efforts on the bibliography and won second place in the Research Competition category. Membership increased by 21%, thanks to Ralph Flaherty. A \$5.00 door prize was initiated to increase attendance at the meetings. Names were drawn from the membership roll, and if the member's name drawn was not present, the \$5.00 was added to the next month's door prize. Apparently, it worked, because the prize seldom reached \$10.00. We successfully concluded the year by receiving the first annual "George Penick Award" for finishing third in the National Chapter Competition Program (second year in a row for the Chapter). It seemed only fitting that the first "Penick" award should have been received by our Chapter, because Mr. Penick was instrumental in organizing the Chapter and, as National President, presented its Charter at our first official meeting.
