Throughout her professional career, Jane has served as Chapter President (1999-2000) and chaired the Community Service Committee for several years. Jane was instrumental in establishing the Chapter's annual Holiday Party. Most recently, Jane served as Chapter Secretary. Thank you, Jane, for 42 years of service to the Chapter.

Marcia Luciano. Marcia retired from state service this week following over 34 years of service to the Massachusetts State Auditor's Office. For the past twelve years, Marcia has extended volunteer efforts for the Chapter by assisting at numerous training and community service events, including blood drives and food donations. An advocate for veterans, Marcia has coordinated Chapter efforts to provide valentines for veterans annually and honor veteran grave sites during the holiday season through the Wreaths Across America Program. Thank you, Marcia, for your service to the Chapter.

Auditor Suzanne Bump. Auditor Bump is the 25th Auditor of Massachusetts and the first woman to serve this role. Elected in 2011, she established a vision to make government work better for the residents of Massachusetts by bringing greater accountability and transparency to state government. One strategy she used to achieve this goal was to become active in the AGA at the Chapter and National levels. During her tenure, the Auditor's Office identified more than \$1.4 billion worth of inefficiencies, misspending, and fraud. The impact of her work has led to changes that have both human and financial impact within programs including Medicaid, child welfare, public safety, public benefits, and education.

Since joining AGA, Auditor Bump has served as the Chapter President from 2013-2014, and received the 2018 AGA National's Professional Development Training Award, the Chapter's 2018 President's Award for Audit Operations, the 2020 AGA's National Leadership Award for Excellence in Government Leadership for State Auditors.

Currently, Auditor Bump serves on AGA National's National Governing Board and chairs AGA's Committee for the Advancement of Women. Thank you, Auditor Bump, for your many contributions to the AGA!

What is CGFM? Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) is a professional certification awarded by the AGA, and a credential that recognizes an individual's specialized knowledge and experience related to management of government finance. Being a CGFM expands career opportunities and distinguishes those who have earned the certification from others in the field of government accounting.

How to become a CGFM? To become a CGFM, candidates are required to pass three exams. The comprehensive exams prove candidates' knowledge in Government Environment, Government Accounting, Financial Reporting, and Budgeting, and Government Financial Management and Control. The Boston Chapter is committed to supporting CGFM candidates and those that have attained the CGFG designation.
