APPLICATION PROCESS

The AGA Boston Chapter is pleased to offer one (1) Walter Frese Memorial Scholarship of \$1,500 to a high school, undergraduate, or graduate student who is currently enrolled or will be enrolled as an undergraduate or graduate student for 2023 in a business or financial management-related program. This includes, but is not limited to, business administration, finance, accounting, economics, human resources, information technology, and cyber security. Please see the "Eligibility" section below to learn more about who can apply.

Background: The late Walter Frese was one of the original 59 Charter Members and one of the original nine Directors to serve on the National Board of the Association of Government Accountants (AGA). Mr. Frese was the second National President of the organization, serving from 1951 to 1952. The American Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) paid special recognition to Walter in its 100th Anniversary issue of the Journal of Accountancy. Mr. Frese's career included the United States Department of the Treasury, the United States General Accounting Office, and the Harvard School of Business.

Eligibility: Applicant must be (or will be) enrolled for 2023 as an undergraduate or graduate student in a program relating to business or financial management. This includes, but is not limited to, majors in business administration, finance, accounting, economics, human resources, information technology, and cyber security. In addition, **graduate student** applicants are considered eligible as long as the applicant is currently working in a **government** business or finance position. <u>Note:</u> Applicants must be a New England area resident or be enrolled in a New England area college (consisting of the states of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, and Connecticut). Though an AGA membership is encouraged, it is <u>NOT</u> required. Award Criteria: Recipients will be selected based factors including scholastic achievement, leadership qualities, extracurricular activities, reference letter, writing ability, and an expressed interest in at least one of the fields previously listed. Furthermore, graduate students will need to provide proof of employment in a government business or finance position.
