The Central Kentucky Chapter established a study group for members preparing to take the CGFM exams. A new group formed in January 2013.

The chapter also supported the CGFM program by providing notice of training relevant to the CGFM examination content. The chapter provided training that met the requirements for continuing professional education for members holding the CGFM designation. To All To Whom These Presents Shall Come:

WHEREAS, The Central Kentucky Chapter of the Association of Government Accountants (AGA), a professional network of 14,500 members in 101 chapters worldwide, has approximately 125 active members representing state, federal, municipal and private sector accountants, auditors and financial managers in Kentucky; and

WHEREAS, AGA's Central Kentucky members have upheld the group's mission of advancing government accountability, continuing broad educational efforts on the high standards of conduct, honor and character in its Code of Ethics and making significant advances both in professional ability and service to Kentuckians by mastering increasingly technical and complex requirements; and

WHEREAS, AGA's Certified Government Financial Manager (CGFM) program demonstrates professional competency by requiring candidates to have appropriate educational and employment history, abide by AGA's Code of Ethicsand pass three expert-level exams in both Governmental Environment, Governmental Financial Management and Control, and Governmental Accounting, Financial Reporting and Budgeting; and it requires each CGFM holder to maintain certification by completing at least eighty hours of continuing professional education in government financial management topics or related technical subjects every two years;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, STEVEN L. BESHEAR, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, do hereby proclaim March 2012 as
