The Central Ohio Chapter of the AGA (COAGA) will be awarding five scholarships to active members, or other selected candidates who are currently enrolled in full or part-time study in a college or universities accounting, business, finance, or computer science programs (or college acceptance pending). Children/grandchildren of an active AGA member who are currently enrolled in full or part-time study in a college or university with any major also qualify (or college acceptance pending).

Award Amounts:	Five scholarships, up to \$1,000 each

Submission Requirements:

The following items are required to be included in the scholarship submission:

- 1. <u>Enrollment</u> Applicants must be currently enrolled in/committed to an undergraduate or graduate program (full-time or part-time) in an accredited college or universities:
 - a. accounting, business, finance, or computer science programs, or
 - b. be of any major if a child/grandchild of an active AGA member

If acceptance/commitment is pending, please explain situation in essay. If selected for scholarship, proof of acceptance/commitment may be required prior to scholarship being disbursed.

- 2. <u>Application Completion</u> Applicants must complete an application.
- 3. <u>Personal Statement and Essay</u> Applicants must submit a personal statement and an essay of 500 words or less that describes your proposed career plans and why you deserve this scholarship.
- 4. <u>Letter of Recommendation</u> Applicants must submit a letter of recommendation from a supervisor, teacher or professor.
- 5. <u>Transcript</u> Applicants must submit a transcript from their High School or their college/university, whichever is most current.

Scholarship Award Criteria:

The following criteria will be considered for award:

- 1. Academics GPA
- 2. <u>AGA Member Relations</u> All applicants are welcome even if they do not have ties to an active AGA member; however, additional consideration will be given to AGA members and relatives of active AGA members. At least one scholarship will be awarded to a member/family member, if applicable.
- 3. <u>Application Presentation</u> Applications should be carefully completed and well presented.
- 4. <u>Personal Statement and Essay</u> Personal statement should be well written and provide insight into the applicant's circumstances and character. Essay should be well written and describe the applicant's proposed career plans and why they deserve the scholarship.
- 5. <u>Letter of Recommendation</u> Recommendation should be from a recent supervisor, teacher, or professor.

Note: Prior recipients are eligible to apply; however, if an applicant received this scholarship in the immediate prior year and other qualified applications are received, they will be given preference.
