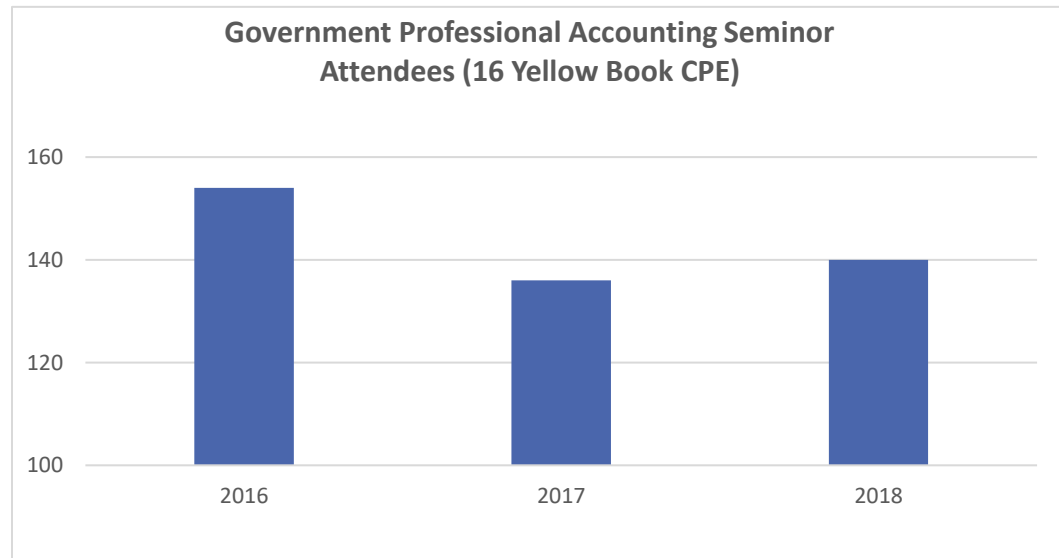

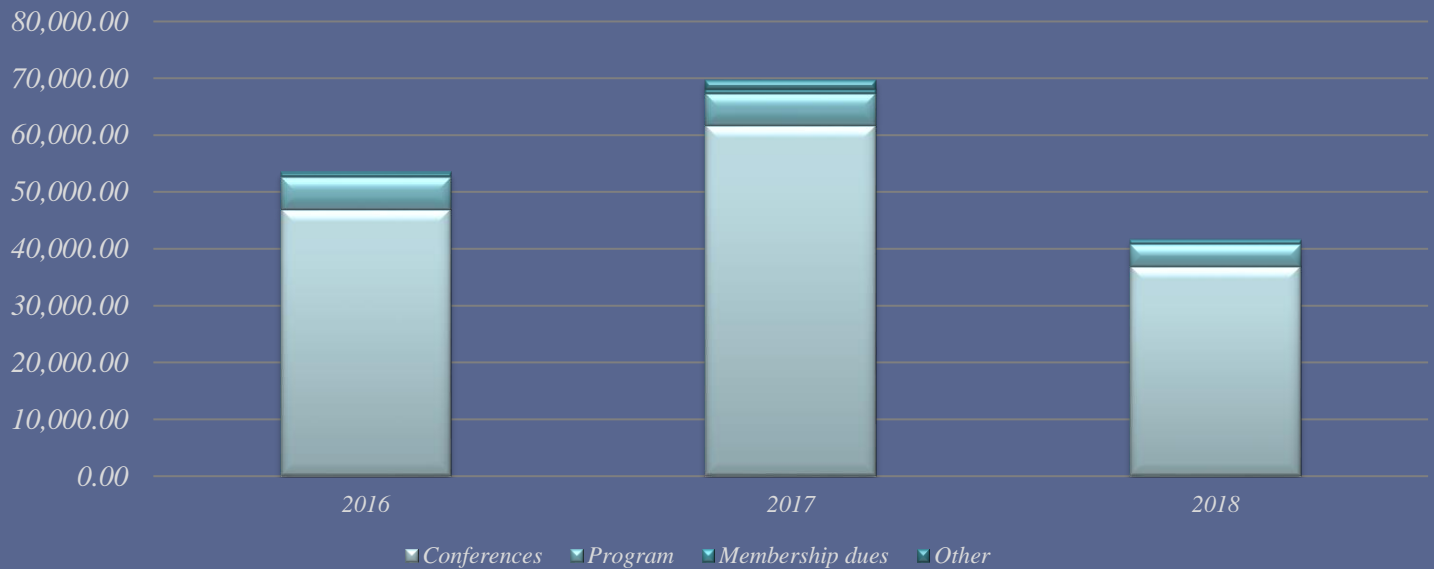

FY 2016 to 2018

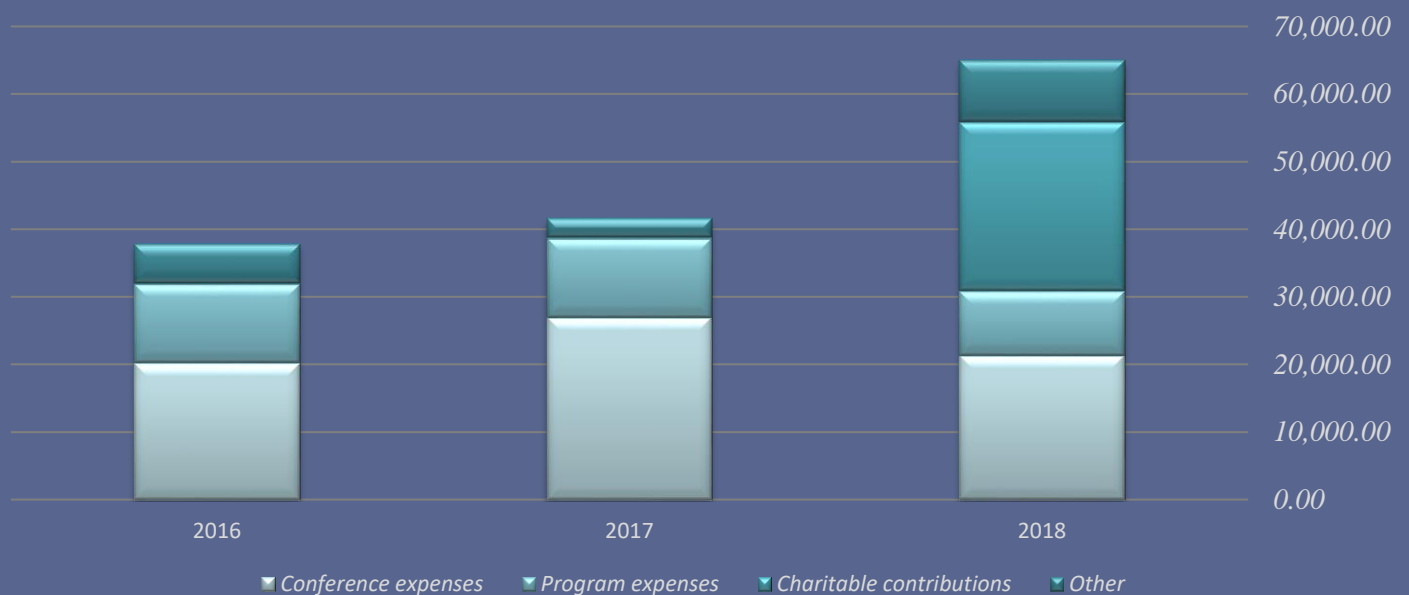
Revenues by Source
