Training & Continuing Education



Our Finances


Revenues and Expenditures



Our FY 2019 Government Professional Accounting Seminar was a 1 (vs. 2) day event resulting in lower conference revenue.

Other revenues primarily related to miscellaneous income.

The higher charitable contributions in FY 2018 was due to the establishment of an endowed scholarship at the University of Hawaii at West Oahu.

Decrease in conference expenses was due to the Government Professional Accounting Seminar being 1 (vs. 2) day consistent with the decrease in revenue.

Decrease in other expenses was due to a travel advance for the Orlando PDT.
