AGA Platinum Level Chapter Recognition Award for the 9th straight year

CGFM Certified Government Financial Manager[®] (CGFM[®]) is a professional certification awarded by AGA, demonstrating competency in governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls, and budgeting at the federal, state, and local levels. To earn the CGFM, candidates must apply for the CGFM Program and meet education and experience requirements. The Hawaii Chapter implemented the "You Pass, We Pay" CGFM program to invest in our members' professional growth. We will reimburse qualifying members (i.e., active AGA Hawaii Chapter members who reside in the state of Hawaii) for the \$70 application fee plus the \$125 cost for each of the three parts for a total of \$445.

The chapter membership represents all levels of government including federal, state, and local municipal governments. In addition, the chapter experiences dedicated support from public accounting firms, its e-professor members and higher education student members.








Our Finances Revenues and Expenditures



The Hawaii Chapter's main source of revenue is our Government Professional Accountability Webinar (GPAW). 2023's GPAW was a two-day training event with 156 attendees. 2022 was a one-day training event with 146 attendees. 2021 was a half day event with 115 attendees.



AGA Hawaii made a \$25,000 contribution to the University of Hawaii at West Oahu in 2022 with no similar contributions in 2021 or 2023. There were no seminar expenses for the 2021 GPAW. Other expenses include travel expenses. 2023 travel expenses were \$6,000 for travel to the AGA National PDT. There were no travel expenses in 2022 and 2021 due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The figures presented above are unaudited figures covering July through June for fiscal years 2021, 2022 and 2023. The Chapter executive committee reviewed the financial reports; however, the information returns from, Form 990-EZ for 2021 and Form 990-N for 2022 and 2023 were independently reviewed.
