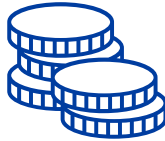

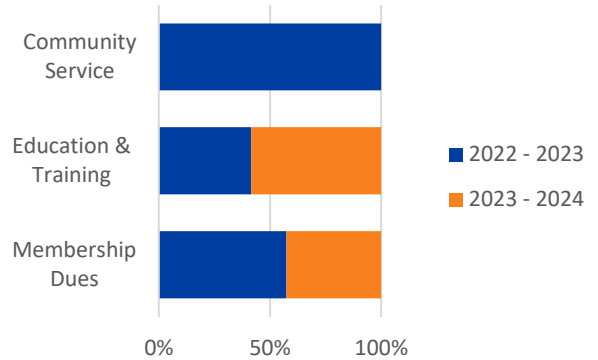

Revenues by Fiscal Year

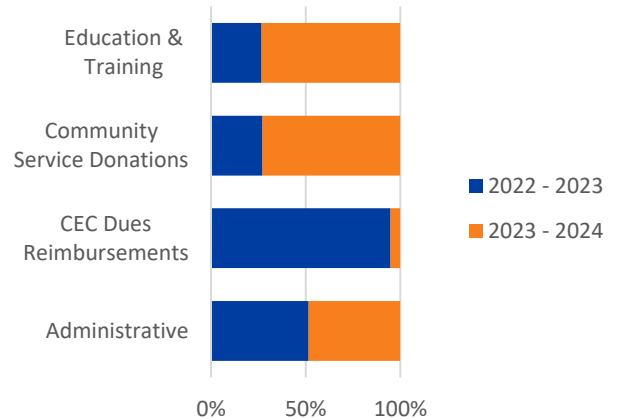

Accountability

The chapter is a 501(c)(3) organization that is comprised of voluntary board members and committee chairpersons. We raise money by offering training courses, CPE credits, hosting dinner meetings, and obtaining sponsorship. The revenues that we receive from these sources are used to pay the costs incurred, and excess funds are held for future use. Our chapter hosts a Spring Forum every year, and we also offer the CGFM courses every other year.

Areas of Focus/Changes for the Coming Year

Goal I

– Engage and Mentor Young Student Professionals

- Regular Mentor-Mentee Interaction: Ensure mentors are available digitally between scheduled meetings to assist with ongoing resume development.
- Seminars and Webinars: Invite students to webinars and seminars where they can interact with professionals and earn credits.
- Resume and Interview Seminars: Organize “Resume Diagnostic” nights and follow up with workshops and one-on-one sessions to ensure students are well-prepared for government job applications.

Goal II

– Advance Awareness of CGFM Certification

- Campus Awareness Events: Host events on local college campuses to discuss the advantages of CGFM certification.
- Round Table Discussions: Organize round table discussions with current CGFM holders to provide insights and advice.
- Training Advertisement: If your chapter offers CGFM training, make sure it is well-publicized among student members.

Goal III

– Increase Awareness of AGA and Benefits

- Maintain Relationships with Colleges: Strengthen ties with local colleges and re-establish connections with other institutions.
- Benefit Explanation: Highlight the benefits of AGA membership to professors and potential members at college fairs and during recruitment events.
- Networking Opportunities: Show the broad benefits of AGA membership, including networking, leadership development, and career advancement.
