GENERAL:

The Chapter year started with a series of meetings during the summer of 1975. One of these meetings was historic: a joint meeting of the officers and directors of the three Washington

area chapters held at the Silver Spring Sheraton. This meeting did much to heal the rift that had existed between the chapters for several years and laid the groundwork for the cooperation that has existed to this day. With the approval of the Chapter Executive Committee, five ad hoc committees were created, two task forces were formed to perform special studies in Chapter administration and an Assistant Secretary and two Assistant Treasurers were appointed. In addition, a bylaw change was passed increasing the number of Directors from seven to ten (to be effective the next fiscal year) to better serve the administrative needs of the Chapter. In order to provide more privacy, larger meeting facilities and (it was hoped) more variety in meals, the meeting location was moved to the Silver Spring Holiday Inn. Two mini-symposiums were held: "Analysis, Evaluation and Auditing Techniques" and "Methods of Productivity Measurements." Both were successful professionally and financially. In an effort to increase meeting attendance, the Chapter subsidized 50 cents of each meal. The "Communique" added two new features: "Meet Your Director" column and "Meet Your Member" column in an effort to familiarize the membership with its Directors and other members. In addition to having our own Chris Peratino serving as National President, Sid Baurmash served on the National Executive Committee and Nat Cutler was hired as the new Executive Vice President of the Association.
