GENERAL:

The programs for the year averaged 105 persons in

attendance, due to the outstanding lineup of speakers. Two meetings were so successful (one setting a single meeting record of 180 persons) that they were held at the University of Maryland Adult Education Center. Membership increased over 37% and our Chapter moved up to become the second largest chapter in the Association. For the third consecutive year we won top recognition for membership improvement at the National Symposium. The Editorial Committee, led by Bill Walsh, created a masthead for our Chapter's newsletter with its own logo (a map of Montgomery and Prince Georges Counties) and re-named it "The Communique." The Education Committee presented a fine program on "Career Opportunities in Government" to six high schools, attendance totalling approximately 200 students as well as a panel discussion on "The Functions and Career Opportunities in Government in Budgeting, Accounting and Auditing" to the Beta Alpha Psi accounting fraternity at the University of Maryland.
