





## What's Next? Challenges and Future Plans

#### Student Engagement

The Ozarks Chapter of AGA believes it is important to invest in our college students, the future workforce. Our chapter plans to continue this investment by having a virtual Q&A panel with local educational institutions. Students will also be invited to our Spring seminar free of charge. The Spring seminar is typically heavily attended by students from Missouri State University, Drury University and Southwest Baptist University.
