Our Chapter

AGA is *the* member organization for government financial management professionals. We support the professional development for members in federal, state, and local government; as well as the private sector, nonprofit, academic, students and retirees. The Shenandoah Valley Chapter, established in September 2011, is located in Winchester, Virginia.

Shenandoah Valley Chapter's current membership consists primarily of Federal government employees, although we do have a few private sector members. The Chapter held meetings from September to May virtually this past year due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We held 2 successful Professional Development Trainings (PDTs) this past Chapter year. Along with the Richmond, Roanoke and Virginia Peninsula chapters, we hosted an annual PDT virtually for 2 days in December.

Our Chapter participates in various community service activities throughout the year. Last year's events included Bright Futures Stuff the Bus, sponsoring wreaths for veterans through Wreaths Across America, supporting Cumberland Valley Breast Cancer Awareness, and the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank BackPack Program. We further supported the AGA National Community Service Fund.
