





Citizen-Centric Report to Our Members Program Year 2022-2023

Our chapter was founded in March 24, 2001, as the Roanoke Chapter. In 2021, the chapter was renamed to the Southwest Virginia Chapter to better represent the geographical area our members work and live in. As of June 30, 2023, our chapter had 59 members with various titles such as Accountant, Auditor, Budget Analyst, CFO, Comptroller, Consultant, and Director of Finance. Finances

Income from "Professional Training" continues to be the most significant revenue source for the chapter. Within this revenue source, 70% can be attributed to our chapter's spring PDT held each April. The remaining 30% reflects the chapter's portion received from the commonwealth PDT.


