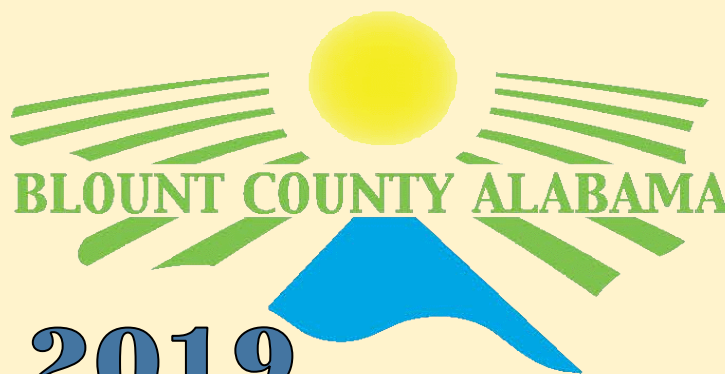

The Blount County Commission is comprised of four commissioners and a chairperson who also serves as the Probate Judge. We are one of 67 counties in the State of Alabama and were created by the territorial legislature in 1818, one year before Alabama was granted statehood. The commission sets an annual budget for county operations, public safety, roads and bridges, parks and recreation, and the health and welfare of the citizens. One of the primary responsibilities of the county commission is maintaining almost 1134 miles of roads and 120 bridges for use by almost 60,000 residents.

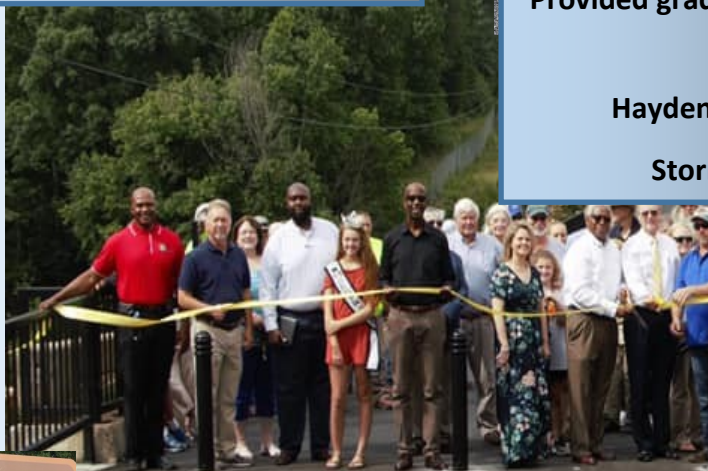

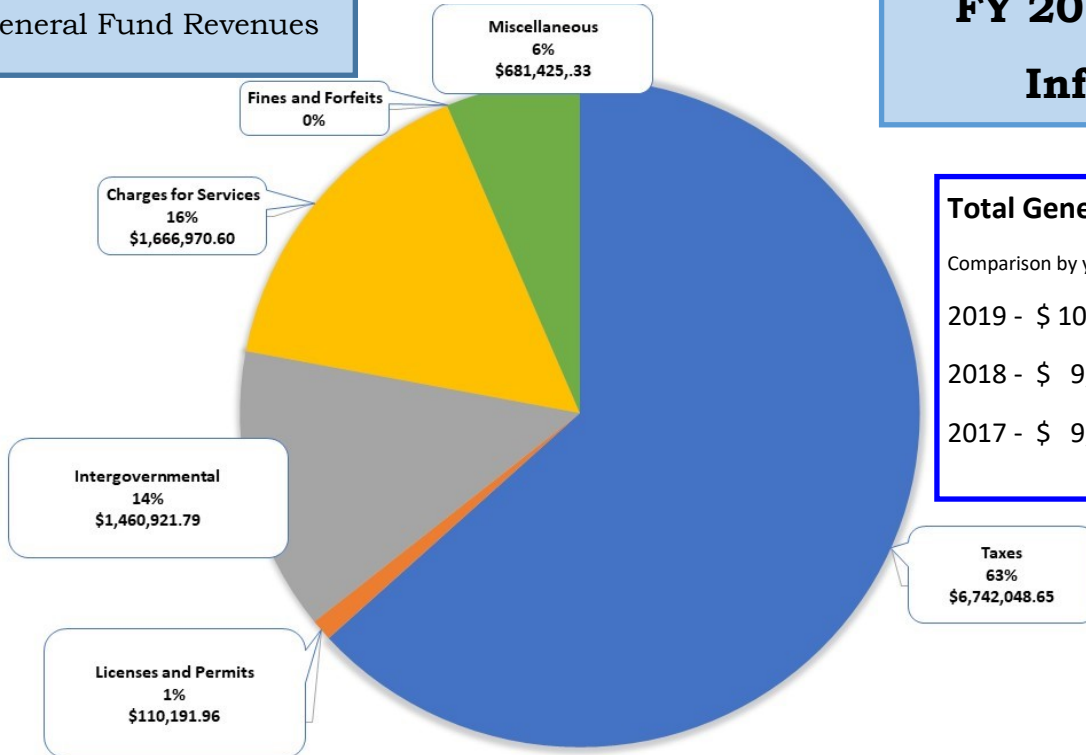

Total General Fund Revenues

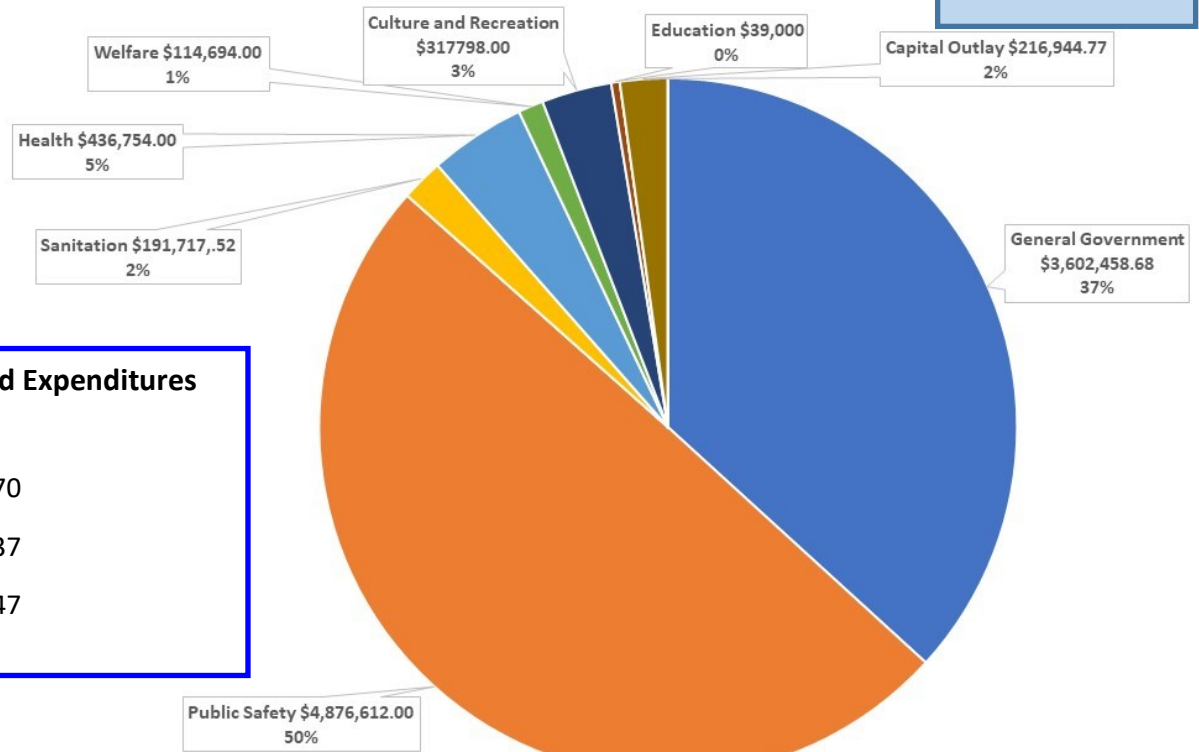
