
### Where are we going?

#### **2020 Accomplishments**

- Our Chapter held fourteen monthly educational meetings throughout the year, as well as an Ethics update and our annual Professional Development Training (PDT) for a total of 42 CPE credits. Attendees averaged 30 for monthly meetings, 29 for ethics, and 114 for the PDT.
- Due to worldwide events, the second half of our program year was quickly converted from live events and offered virtually, including our first ever virtual PDT.
- The Phoenix Chapter of AGA earned enough Chapter Recognition Points during the 2019-2020 Program Year to be the recipient of the Platinum Chapter Designation Award from AGA Nationals.
- This year our Chapter awarded one scholarship totaling \$1,000 to a student identified for academic excellence and community service achievements.
- Our Chapter offered scholarships to members who passed the CGFM exam this year.
- We assisted with homeless/crisis care and homeless pet assistance drives and provided a financial donation to the Phoenix Rescue Mission for the less fortunate.
- We participated in Feed My Starving Children packaging food for people in developing nations.
- We continued our sponsorship program to partner with other organizations to further our mission.
- We held events at Arizona State
   University and Grand Canyon University
   to encourage new graduates to seek a
   career path of working in Government
   Financial Management.

Our membership increased slightly due to strong recruiting efforts and networking.





- We offered monthly education meetings at varying sites across the valley, and virtual meetings, to encourage participation from non-traditional attendees.
