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






In the 2020-2021 program year the revenue received was lower than the previous year because our PDT was virtual and the cost for attendance was decreased. We also were unable to have any in person meetings or luncheon's which impacted our financials. The luncheon style CPE offered this year was free to all participants, members or not. We also purchased three National AGA webinars so that 30 of our members could attend free of charge.



The pie chart is a break-down of expense categories for the 2020-2021 program year. Most expenses, 67%, for the year related to the 2020PDT. These expenses were refunds processed to members that had registered for the PDT before COVID and the State of Emergency. The member benefits are for four CEC members to attend the National AGA PDT virtually. The remainder of the expenses are operating expenses and donations.
