CHALLENGES

Years after the pandemic, AGA Guam continues to conduct general membership meetings virtually. While this format makes it easy for our members to attend, it lacks the interactions of in-person meetings.

Unfortunately, this shift to virtual meetings has affected our revenue. We are exploring other ways to make this up.

One approach we have implemented is charging our members a minimal fee to earn CPEs during our general membership meetings. Overwhelmingly, 50% of our members who responded to our survey said they joined our local chapter to earn CPEs.



We continue to grow our membership base. In PY 2023-2024, we have 257 members, compared to 241 the previous year—a 7% increase. This growth not only indicates interest in our local chapter, but also supports the continuation of our mission into the future.

The virtual meetings have strengthened our relationships within the region. Other AGA Guam members from the Pacific Islands can attend the general membership meetings without the high costs associated with in-person attendance.

We continue to hold our mixers, events where upcoming professionals can meet and interact with the members of our local chapter.
