




Who are We?



In 2021-2022 we started to climb out of the Pandemic and presented free Webinars to help our members cope, including Federal Response to the COVID-19 Pandemic (4/16/21) and CARES Act and Covid-19 on the Single Audit (2/16/22 – graphic below).

Financial Information

Our chapter has been a Nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization since May 1991. A 501(c)(3) is defined as an organization for, among others, educational, charitable, and scientific purposes. As such, we aren't in the business to make money, but rather to earn enough to allow us to offer no- or low-cost professoinal development, education and training, and networking opportunities to our members.





We file an annual Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax with the IRS.

Revenues

Our primary source of revenue comes from member dues to AGA National. We have not collected local chapter dues for several years. For an average of 30 members, this equals about \$450 annually.



Other income comes from members registering for a meeting at which we provide lunch, and our goal is to collect only as much as we spend on food.





We also earn a minimal amount of interest income on bank deposits.

Expenses



Our primary expenses are to maintain sponsorship certification with the Texas State Board of Public Accountancy, which has been \$400 annually for the last several years. This allows our training to be

recognized as Continuing Professional Education (CPE) for Texas CPAs, as well as for several other certifications, such as the CGFM.



Other expenses are for food served at member meetings.
