CGFM Certified Government Financial Manager® (CGFM®) is a professional

certification awarded by AGA, demonstrating competency in governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls, and budgeting at the federal, state, and local levels. To earn the CGFM, candidates must apply for the CGFM Program and meet education and experience requirements. The Hawaii Chapter implemented the <u>"You Pass, We Pay</u>" CGFM program to invest in our members' professional growth. We will reimburse qualifying members (i.e., active AGA Hawaii Chapter members who reside in the state of Hawaii) for the \$70 application fee plus the \$125 cost for each of the three parts for a total of \$445.








Our Finances Revenues and Expenditures



The Hawaii Chapter's main source of revenue is Government Professional Accountability Webinar (GPAW). PY 2023's GPAW was two days training event with 156 attendees. PY 2022 and PY 2024 were a one-day training events.



AGA Hawaii made a \$25,000 contribution to the University of Hawaii at West Oahu in PY 2022 and \$50,000 contribution to the University of Hawaii Foundation in PY 2024 with no similar contributions in PY 2023. The PY 2023 travel expenses are higher than the budget by \$3,000. Other expenses include Directors and Officers insurance premiums of approximately \$1,600 in PYs 2024, 2023, and 2022.

The figures presented above are unaudited figures covering July through June for fiscal years 2022, 2023 and 2024. The Chapter executive committee reviewed the financial reports; however, the information returns from, Form 990-N for 2022, 2023, and 2024 were independently reviewed.
