

Special appreciation to Deb Strahler for volunteering to serve as President during the upcoming year.




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Fiscal Year Financial Summary

The decrease in-person attendance since the Covid pandemic had a continuing negative impact on the finances of the East TN Chapter. Total revenues decrease in FY 2023 by \$237, mainly due to decreased meeting attendance. As a result, the chapter purposely reduced meeting expenses by \$2,237. However, meeting revenue was still not sufficient to offset meeting expenses. PDT revenues remained relatively flat as a higher price was charged for an in-person conference in the current year compared to the virtual option in the previous year, even though attendance was down. PDT expenses increased \$3,893 in the current year as result of being in-person instead of virtual. Finally, despite the decline in participation in the current year, the East TN chapter still donated a decent portion of its revenues to charity in the current year. The financials tell the story of a fiscal year riddled with participation challenges. This upcoming year, there are plans in place to counteract the drop in revenues and to boost engagement of membership. The plans are captured in the Strategic Plan for the East TN Chapter.





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WHAT'S NEXT.

2024 Goals for East TN Chapter

We plan to provide the same level of service this year as last completing the requirements for a Gold Award. We plan to accomplish the following during this program year. Provider live CPE during lunch meetings in September, November, January, February, March, and April. Live annual two-day Professional Development Training will be in October. Our December meeting will be dedicated to a local charity. Our annual awards lunch will be in May 2024. We are maintaining our subscription through AGA to Conferences i/o and Zoom so we can offer half of our meetings in a remote format to increase participation of those individuals who prefer remote formats.

Our administrative goals for the year are to reduce our board seats and fill the remaining ones with dedicated individuals and future leaders. We plan on finishing the process of updating our bylaws and legal name to AGA East Tennessee Chapter.

Our chapter leadership is excited about this year's program and look forward to implementing it.

SOME HIGHLIGHTS FROM OUR 2024 STRATEGIC PLAN

We plan to accomplish these goals in the upcoming year:

1. To increase participation & interaction at meetings and events.

2. Obtain speakers to meet Chapter members needs and relevant topics and offer educational speakers at 8 monthly meetings.

3. To change the number & nature of board offices to better meet the chapter and national needs.

4. Provide CGFM candidates with additional support in the form of mentors and reimbursement for expenses.

5. To continue publishing the updated monthly newsletter, and continue to expand website and social media presence.

6.Survey members to determine how to better serve them within the AGA framework.

7. Support to local organization for the homeless and domestic abuse.
