Our Chapter

The Shenandoah Valley Chapter, established in September 2011, is located in Winchester, Virginia. Our current membership consists primarily of Federal government employees, although we do have a few state government, private sector, students and retirees as members. The Chapter held meetings from September to May virtually this past year due to beginning to return to a normalcy after the COVID-19 pandemic. We held a successful 2day hybrid Professional Development Training in December in collaboration with the Richmond, Southwest Virginia and Virginia Peninsula chapters.

Our Chapter participates in various community service activities throughout the year. Last year's events included Bright Futures Adopt a Family for the Holidays, sponsoring wreaths for veterans through Wreaths Across America, the Katie Teets Bradshaw Comfort House, and the Youth Development Center.
