

The Pathways Program offers federal internship and employment opportunities for current students, recent graduates and those with an advanced degree. There are three different paths available:





Certification



- Certified Government Financial Manager ® (CGFM®) credential is the ONLY certification covering governmental accounting, auditing, financial reporting, internal controls and budgeting at the federal, state and local levels
- Demonstrates expertise in the field of government financial management
- Recognizes the unique skills and special knowledge required of today's government financial managers



Certification



Today's applicants must meet these requirements:

- 1. agree to abide by AGA's Code of Ethics
- 2. have a bachelor's degree from an accredited U.S. college or university *(exception for seniors!)*
- 3. have two years of experience in U.S. government financial management
- 4. pass three CGFM examinations (\$135 each)



Your Path to Certification



- → Be within 1 year of graduation
 - → Apply online to become a CGFM candidate (\$36 for student members!)
 - → Prepare! (study guides, practice exams, virtual courses)
 - → Pass three examinations (Passing CGFM exams looks great on a resume!)
 - → Have 2 years of approved experience internships might count!
 - → Become a CGFM!








Demographics by Employer Type

Scholarships

National Academic Scholarships

Are you or a family member pursuing undergraduate or graduate studies in disciplines such as accounting, economics, finance, information systems/technology or public administration? If so, consider applying for an AGA academic scholarship!

*Note: The 2022 application period is now closed.

This year, AGA will award:

- Rising college freshman: Two scholarships (full-time)
- Undergraduate students: Four scholarships (full-time)
- Graduate students: Three scholarships (full-time or part-time)
- Community service: Two scholarships among any of the three categories noted above.

^{*}All scholarships are worth \$3,000.

National Collegiate Leadership Scholarship:

Each year, AGA selects up to ten undergraduate students to attend the National Leadership Training (NLT) in February. Note: Application deadline is Friday, November 4, 2022, at 11:59 p.m. ET. If you have questions, contact scholarships@agacgfm.org

Young Professionals Training Scholarship:

Each year, AGA selects up to ten young professionals to attend the Professional Development Training (PDT) in July. The 2023 application period is open until Monday, May 16 at 11:59 p.m. E.T.


